Abbreviations

Definition: An abbreviation is a shortened form of a word or several words.

Different type of abbreviations:

- acronym
- Initialism
- Truncations
- Portmanteau

Punctuation related to abbreviations.

 An abbreviation is usually found in the written form and is not pronounced as it is written.

Example: Mr Mister

 If the abbreviation ends in the last letter of the word, then the full stop is omitted.

Example: Dr Mr Mrs

• If the initial letters of words are used, the full stop is omitted.

Example: USA United States of America

SPCA Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals

• If the abbreviation consists of just the first few letters of the word it represents, you have to use a full stop.

Example: Sat. Saturday Jan. January
Mon. Monday Feb. February
abbr. abbreviation adj. adjective
adv. adverb ans. Answer

aux. auxillary P.T.O.Please turn over

• Phrases taken from other languages, and their abbreviations are also written with full stops.

Example: R.S.V.P. Repondez s'il vous plait (Please reply)

etc. etcetera (and so on)

e.g. exempli gratia (for example/example given)

viz. namely

NB nota bene, note well, very important

• If the abbreviation includes the first and last consonants of the word, no full stop is needed.

Example: pls please rd road

Mr Mister crt court

Dr doctor maths mathematics

n noun v verb Sgt Sergeant Rd Road However, recent abbreviations do not use a full stop even if the last consonant is left out.

Example: cell cellular (phone)

kb kilobyte MB megabyte

GB gigabyte Computer data-capacity units

TB terabyte

Acronym

An acronym is a word made up of the first letter (or the first few letters) of a number of words. The word is pronounced as it is spelled. No full stops are used.

Example: COSATU Congress of South African Trade Unions

AIDS Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome

UNICEF United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund

NASA National Aeronautics and Space Administration

SARS South African Revenue Service

ESCOM Electricity Supply Commission

NUMSA National Union of Mineworkers of South Africa

laser light amplification by stimulated emission of radiation

radar radio detection and ranging

scuba self-contained underwater breathing apparatus

PTY (LTD) Proprietary (Limited)

Cellphone technology has resulted in many abbreviations. These are only appropriate in text communications.

Example: cu see you

Initialism

An *initialism* is an abbreviation where the first letter of a number of words is used instead of saying the whole name out load. With initialisms you pronounce each letter separately.

Example: LOL Laugh out load

FET Further Education and Training

TV television CV Curriculum Vitae

IT information technology COD Cash on delivery

Truncations

Truncations are words that have part of them cut off.

Example: exam for examination

Portmanteau

Portmanteau is a combination of two words.

Example: **infomercial** from **info**rmation and com**mercial**.
